

At a New Beginning

We find ourselves on the verge of a new beginning. What that is exactly, or where that journey will take us, it is too early to tell. What we do know is that God is guiding us each and every step.

Saint Paul writes in First Corinthians chapter 13, "For now we see in a glass, darkly; but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; but then I will know fully . . . even as I have been fully known."

I love that last phrase. God already fully knows us. God already fully knows our struggles and worries, our hopes and dreams. Even before we know what's going on, the first thing we come to discover is that God has been with us all along, calling us forward, leading us into what comes next, as we dive deeper into the mystery of love divine that heals a hurting world.

When Jesus was preparing his disciples for the time of his death – a time when they would not see him, when they would be confused and anxious, when they wouldn't know which direction to go or for what purpose to live, so instead, they would just huddle together – he told them simply to love as he loves.

In only three days' time, a new beginning would emerge from the tomb, one the disciples could not imagine or comprehend. But as they were on the verge of it, God already fully knew them, and the word they received from God in their crucial moment was simple: love.

It is the same word Saint Paul shared with the church in Corinth as the people waited to know fully what God will reveal, saying "faith, hope and love abide; and the greatest of these is love." As Unity looks forward to our final Strategic Visioning Retreat and as we celebrate the new beginning of life emerging from death on Easter, the Holy Spirit brings our focus to the same word. Love.




Join Unity's Spring Book Club

CommUNITY Notes from Council

Here are just a few highlights of what your council has been doing and what issues we are facing. Please note that these are highlights and will not include everything.

- Unity's Annual Congregational Meeting was held on Sunday, February 4th. We welcome to Jr Smith to Council!
- Council decided that Unity would join our area churches in worship for Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. We are excited for this opportunity to worship and commune with several of our neighborhood churches!
- Council met with representative from 3 different roofing companies as in deciding what course of action was best for us.
- Council and church staff are working quickly to resolve our emergency sewer/plumbing situation. This could result in the building being closed for several days.
- A Fundraiser Night has been scheduled for May 6th at the Panara on 27th Street. Unity earns 25% of all sales when a flyer or FUND4U code is presented when ordering.



Property Updates

<u>Sewer/Plumbing Clog Emergency:</u> On Wednesday night February 21st, a plumbing problem in the men's bathroom and the office lobby was discovered. Unfortunately, as we have brought in professionals to diagnose the issue, we have discovered extensive problems with our plumbing system. The main problem is a clog in our sewer line that we haven't found yet. The clog has caused leaks in several of the building's pipes that has caused damage in some areas of the basement near the fellowship hall.

Council and church staff are working quickly to resolve this emergency situation. Work is expected to begin early March. This could result in the building being closed for several days. We don't know how much the repairs and cleanup work will total, but we know it will cost at least \$10,000 just for the excavation of the pipes to find the problem, in addition to further expenses for asbestos abatement, pipe repair/replacement, and professional cleanup and disinfection. We are working with our insurance company to determine if and how much of the project will be covered. We are also blessed to have money set aside for emergency property issues in Unity's Endowment Fund that will help with the expenses. Please watch or listen for updates as this emergency situation progresses.

<u>Roof:</u> The Council and the Congregation voted to approve the repair of the roof to get us a couple more years. The Company approved to make the repair is Great Lakes Roofing. A new contract has yet to be made since so much time has lapsed since the first quote was issued. At the annual meeting, it was advised to add the clause "not to exceed" a certain amount (ie: not to exceed double the quote). Council has decided to put this project on hold until we deal with the sewer/plumbing issue.

<u>Shared gifts:</u> The Lutheran Church of the Great Spirit shared their grant money with Unity. We were able to secure a new CommUNITY Meal sign outside the office/fellowship hall entrance on Oklahoma Avenue and repair our kitchen freezer. Thanks to the Church of the Great Spirit, those in need of a meal or the food pantry will have accurate information and the kitchen freezer will house food acquired for our CommUNITY Meal.

Our Loss in 2023 was \$19,036.59. The loss was partially deducted from the reserve of \$8,984.39 and the \$10,052.20 balance left was deducted from the Funds of Remembrance leaving us with no reserve in 2024 and a Funds of Remembrance of \$5,561.61. Some may object to the use of the Funds of Remembrance covering the deficit, but the legacy of those who gave in memory of someone lives on in the life of Unity to allow us to live Worship 24/7 for another year.

In the Property Reserve Fund, we have \$9,644.15 in cash available the end of January. We are still dealing with the oil leak issue. In February, a payment of \$1657.50 was made to the firm reporting to the WDNR from 10/30/2019 thru 7/21/2023. (7 total).

The 2024 budget reflects a loss of \$28,882.63, with no reserve. Budgeted for 2024 is \$90,000 in pledged and unpledged income and a total income of \$137,114.38. Our expense budget for 2024 is \$165,997.01. Please refer to the annual meeting packet for further information on the budget.

Stewardship:

The Stewardship campaign theme for 2024 is "We are God's Handiwork". Total number of households is 105; 37 households have committed their support. Thank you for supporting Unity is Jesus' mission here. In following Jesus, we have clothed and fed those who are in need. We have spread the Word through our social media outlets. We have met our neighbors through our fundraisers and used our space to share with groups who have come to Milwaukee for service or who have a not-for-profit organization needing space.
